Programme Highlights

Māori Language Week

Māori Language Week gives us a chance to celebrate something truly unique to our country. The theme this year was 'Kia Kaha te Reo Māori'. 'Kia Kaha' means 'be strong' so when we say 'Kia Kaha Te Reo Māori' we're saying 'Let's make the Māori language strong'.

Māori language isn't just about teaching Māori words or sentence structures. At kindy we regularly and actively us Te Reo in our daily practice alongside and with the children. We also use waiata (songs) as a valuable way for our children to learn the language. We recognise the importance and traditions that are connected to the Treaty of Waitangi and incorporate these into our programme. During Maori language week the children shared their favourite Māori waiata and started learning a new karakia to say before our meal times.

Grandparent's day

The children spent a lovely morning at kindy with their grandparents or other special person in their lives recently. They loved showing them their kindy, introducing them to all their friends and showing them some of the special resources that we have here at kindy. children shared with us their favourite things about the morning and they enjoyed playing and reading with their grandparents and eating chocolate cake!

It is a privilege to host Grandparent's morning and to meet extended family that have a special place in our children's hearts.

Democracy at kindy

Last month we introduced the concept of democracy in early childhood and our vision of ensuring all our children feel empowered throughout the day. We have been looking at opportunities where children can be active leaders and conscious decision makers by inviting children to lead us in our music sessions, decide on what resources they would like available and voting on what books we read or games we play.

It has been interesting seeing the children's reactions to their peers taking the lead and being part of decision making by voting. Listening to our children's theories enhances the possibilities of discovering how children think, how they question and they develop relationship with reality. It's important that children are involved in shaping their own environment and influencing the conditions for learning and play.



New name and brand

We are very excited to announce to our kindergarten community that St Lukes Kindergarten is getting a fresh new name and brand. After 50 years in the Remuera community it is time for a new look that reflects our unique kindergarten and its values.
