# Resilience

Resilience is the ability to cope and thrive in the face of negative events, challenges or adversity. Key attributes resilience in children of include social competence, a sense of agency or responsibility, attachment to family, to kindy and to learning, optimism and

supporting them to become more successful with using their communication skills to appropriately navigate social situations within the context of play. This is a very important part of our curriculum and enables our children to relate to others in ways that enrich and extend their learning.

An important part of supporting children's social development is providing a learning environment that is calm and unhurried to allow time for teachers to work alongside children and support their interactions with others. On a daily basis we are building children's confidence in relating to others, initiating conversations, taking turns, asking questions, respecting the views and opinions of others, caring for our younger children, becoming independent problem solvers and negotiating desired

#### positive self-esteem.

When children are resilient, they are braver, more curious, more adaptable, and more able to extend their reach into the world. The great news is that resilience is something that can be nurtured in all children. One of our roles as teachers is to outcomes with others. This competence supports dispositions such as resilience, persevering with a task and showing empathy for others.

In a practical sense these skills are being developed through everyday social interactions with children and teachers, support with providing appropriate language in social situations, role modelling positive interactions. discussions about feelings and the use of puppets and role play at mat times. It is important that children learn to identify and analyse different options to overcome problems and develop the language necessary to communicate their needs, feelings and ideas with others to solve conflicts. When children can solve their own problems they can feel empowered and confident socially which ultimately enhances their self-esteem.

build resilience and we do this by building a child's sense of belonging at kindergarten, valuing their contribution to the kindergarten community, respecting their views and opinions, fostering a positive self-image and supporting social competence.
