Programme Highlights

Lockdown

With another COVID-19 level 3 lockdown in August kindy has been quiet with only a few children attending. Our families have been busy at home supporting children and juggling their own work commitments. Supporting our Cultures

We have introduced two new cultural initiatives to the children recently — Maori days of the week and greeting of the month.

Our older children have been learning the days of the week in Maori during mat times, introduced through learning a new song. We are intending to extend this to include the date, month and weather over time.

We have also introduced a greeting of the month which is being displayed in our entrance. Each month we will choose a different language to learn and use every day. We are excited to grow and extend on our knowledge of the wonderful languages from around the world. This months language was Cook Island Maori in support of Cook Island language week where 'Hello' is 'Kia Orana'. We see every child's own language as a treasure and ensure that their cultural heritage is valued and in doing so strengthen their sense of integration and belonging at kindy.

Supporting Transitions

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Thank you to all of our parents who supported our current planned self review by completing one of our parent surveys on transitions. Parent feedback is very important to us in maximising the learning from our review and to improve outcomes for our children. Key learning was:

Transitions into kindergarten are well supported with value placed on the primary caregiving role between teachers and children, empathetic teachers and contact by phone or text when a child is unsettled at drop off. Some consistency of information shared at the outset of transition visits about what to expect was identified to support improvement.

Our children are experiencing positive transitions from **kindergarten to school**. Many aspects of our programme support what parents value as important in preparing children for school and supporting their transitions. Some academic support by way of numerical knowledge and following multiple instructions along with knowledge of a wider network of schools to better support transitions were some areas to support improvement.

Our next area of focus for this review is to visit local schools to build our knowledge of school environments, expectations of new entrant teachers when children start school and exploring how we can work alongside schools to better support our children's transition to school.

Building Independence: Our kindergarten programme supports children to build independence as an important skill in preparing our children for school and becoming active and valued members of our community. There are many ways in which we foster this independence such as encouraging our children to take responsibility for naming their art work, taking their shoes on and off and teaching them to go to the toilet and eat their lunch independently. Parent's can support this also by encouraging children to dress themselves, put their own shoes on, walking into kindergarten independently, putting their lunch box into the basket and ensuring that children wear clothing and shoes at kindergarten that they can manage independently.

Staff absences: Mrs Dudley, Miss Reidy and Ms Bloem will all be on leave for a week in September. Mrs Hensby-Bennett will be supporting the teaching team as required during this time.

Holidays: Please let us know if you are planning on taking a holiday from kindergarten during the October school holidays so that we can manage our staffing during this time.
