Programme Highlights

Cultural Day

This month we celebrated cultural diversity by coming together as a community and celebrating our cultures. The children wore traditional costumes and participated in singing and dancing from around the world. We all enjoyed traditional cultural activities such as making Māori poi's and Chinese fans, building Thai stupas, creating famous landmarks out of loose parts, flag drawing, playing toss the can, a traditional Dutch game and hurling, a traditional Irish game. We also tasted some delicious new flavours through the sharing of cultural food. It was a true celebration of all cultures.

Friendships

We have continued our focus on building emotional and

social competency supporting children with making and maintaining friendships. Every day our children are learning how to engage with others by playing together. They build closer connections through developing friendships and strengthen these relationships through actively listening to their friends needs and requests, taking turns, negotiating, problem solving, compromising and helping each other.

Friendships built organically through shared interests and experiences, and it's not something that we can force, but can be encouraged. Teachers draw the attention of nearby children to things that others are doing. We place resources in ways that encourage interaction and

sharing. We prompt children to help one another if need be, often redirect their questions to nearby peers and support them with role modelling appropriate language when required.

This learning is linked to the Maori value of Whaahoahoa - making friends and being friendly, polite, sociable and pleasant towards others.

Christmas Show Rehearsals

We have been busy in the last few weeks preparing for our children's Christmas show. The children are learning new songs, have chosen roles and started rehearsals in the church. This is a big focus this term as we continue with our practices and begin making props. We will look forward to sharing our children's talents with you in our Christmas show soon.

Transitions - Engaging with Schools

We have visited local schools to support our planned self review on transitions and found that most new entrant environments have introduced some form of play-based learning over the last 2 years but remain traditional with formal structured learning expected of children.

Feedback from discussions with new entrant teachers and leaders was variable with general agreement that important skills to support an effective transition to school included social competency, independence and self-help skills, basic literacy skills such as name recognition and writing their name, an established pencil grip, cutting skills and the ability to sit on the mat and concentrate for a short period of time. The recognition of other letters and sounds was considered useful by some schools only.

Schools also valued support from ECE in encouraging longer days at kindy to build stamina for school, ensuring children are taught correctly especially with avoiding the use of upper case letters when writing their name and providing opportunities for children to spend time concentrating for periods of time and following simple instructions.
