Garden

With the new year we have harvested the last of our vegetables in the garden and made our very own roast vegetable hummus. We have also prepared and replanted our garden with a variety of vegetables including beans and corn that we will soon learn about as part of our Know Me Eat Me programme.

The children have a huge sense of pride in their garden and really enjoy caring for the plants and watching them grow.

Carpentry

Since returning to kindy we have reintroduced carpentry tools and materials to our programme. We are starting slowly with hammers, nails and screwdrivers and have been reminding our children about the safety rules when managing these resources.

Carpentry gives children the opportunity to express their creativity in a 3 dimensional way. Children are learning how to handle tools properly and are developing a wide range of skills such as hand / eye coordination, science and mathematical skills, problem solving, sharing, exchanging ideas, cooperating and building a sense of pride and achievement.

As we explore and extend our children's learning in this area we would love any insights from our families of skills and resources that we can use in this area.

Carpentry resources: With the focus on re-establishing our carpentry space this year we are looking for any resources that can be used to support this learning space. In particular we need a supply of small pieces of untreated timber that can be used by the children. Other useful items are milk bottle tops, corks or cork product, laminate samples.
