Programme Highlights

Enjoying Music

Musical play has been a sustained interest over a number of weeks and we have been supporting this interest by providing many different musical experiences for children to engage in. We have been offering a wide range of musical instruments including shakers, triangles, tamborines, xylophone, rakau sticks and buckets for drums. We have made our own pois and microphones and set up for performing. stages Children are sharing their singing talent by sharing songs using our microphones at mat time. We have also explored different cultural and instrumental music.

Exploring music is a wonderful way for children to express their feelings through

their voice and body. They develop rhythm, are creative and have fun.

ENGAGE programme

Our teaching team commenced a professional programme development called ENGAGE in August. This programme is funded by the Ministry of Education to support all early learning centres nationally and is drawn from New Zealand based research to support the building of selfregulations skills in children.

The core focus of ENGAGE is to improve children's self regulation skills across a broad range of areas encompassing emotional skills, cognitive/thinking skills and behavioural skills. These skills are developed through the use of fun everyday games supported by the use of intentional language. With 40 games to draw upon there is a lot of variety to capture children's interest and we are having a lot of fun exploring these games with the children. We have another professional development programme in September to further extend on the use of these games in practice.



Cultural Day

This month we celebrated our cultural day. We got to see and wear some wonderful costumes as well as participate in singing and dancing from around the world. We enjoyed some traditional cultural activities such as building Thai stupas in the sandpit and recreating famous landmarks in the block corner. Tamariki made Indian Mandala patterns from bottle tops and painted beautiful Pasifika patterns. Playing 'Toss the Can' from Ms. Bloem's native Holland was very popular and so was the Kiwi gum boot throw. Practicing to pick up noodles with the chopsticks was a great fine

motor activity. They were creative making beautiful Chinese decorative fans, colourful Persian geometric shape patterns and English swords and shields.

At morning tea the tables outside were full of tasty kai from around the world which we shared together as a community. It was a true celebration and learning of all cultures within our kindergarten. Thank you to all of our families who contributed to our wonderful day!
