

Programme Highlights

Supporting Culture

This month we celebrated both the Tongan and Maori and language weeks. Children extended their knowledge of these languages at mat times and music times and through sharing books together. We celebrated the Tongan and Maori cultures through legends, cultural resources and art and craft activities, taking the opportunity to revisit some of our cultural day learning.

ENGAGE Programme

We have continued to actively include lots of ENGAGE games programme within our throughout September and have been really heartened by the level of engagement and obvious enjoyment from the children. We have all had a lot of fun. We have spent time focusing on each of the focus areas including emotional skills, cognitive/thinking skills and behavioural skills.

Our teaching team attended another professional learning course in September to support us in further extending the use of these games in practice. We are looking forward to continuing our focus on this programme and seeing the impact that this has on our children's self regulation skills over time.

Glue Gun Creations

Our glue gun table has been a hive of activity over the last month with children busy creating lots of individual and group art projects. We can barely keep up with the provision of resources to support them in making their ideas come to life.

This is a great activity to refine fine motor skills, hand eye coordination and strengthen hand muscles. The glue gun requires children to pull the trigger back fairly hard and manipulate the glue to land in the right spot. This development is important in supporting children to gain the skills needed to grip a pencil when learning to write.

We are starting to see more children working on small projects and revisiting their work, creating more complex creations. By doing this we are able to support them to extend on their ideas and revisit their learning in a really positive and meaningful way.

If any families have any resources to share with us for the children to use on the glue gun table please bring them along to kindy and we will put them to good use.

Grandparent Day

This month we celebrated our annual Grandparent Day on Tuesday 19th September. The children shared a lovely morning with all of their wonderful grandparents or special family members showing them all the things that they enjoy doing at kindy, introducing them to

Communication Corner

Availability: We continue to have some limited availability over the next few months so if families require any further support with short term additional days in the lead up to Christmas please get in touch. Feedback: An important part of our curriculum is obtaining parent / whanau voice on your child's development and what we are doing at kindergarten. We encourage families to provide feedback on our curriculum, self reviews and what is happening at kindergarten. Feedback on learning stories is a good way to acknowledge your child's development and share stories and links with what they are doing at home. Please use the 'feedback' option on the parent portal to do this in an efficient way. Parent teacher meetings are another way to share your views. By providing feedback we can ensure that we best support your child's development at kindergarten.
